

**VO: OVER THIRTY -THREE THOUSAND U.S. SERVICE MEMBERS LOST THEIR LIVES  
IN THE KOREAN WAR.**

**THE KOREAN WAR BEGAN ON JUNE TWENTY FIFTH, NINETEEN FIFTY AND  
FIGHTING ENDED WHEN THE ARMISTICE WAS SIGNED ON JULY TWENTY  
SEVENTH, NINETEEN FIFTY THREE AFTER THREE YEARS OF BRUTAL FIGHTING.  
COLONEL DAVID CLARK IS THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE DIRECTOR OF THE  
SIXTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE KOREAN WAR COMMEMORATION COMMITTEE.**

**COL: WHEN THE NORTH INVADED THE SOUTH IN JUNE OF NINETEEN FIFTY, THE  
LIBERTY AND FREEDOM OF AN ENTIRE NATION, REALLY, WAS AT STAKE. SO  
THE UNITED STATES AND THE UNITED NATIONS RUSHED TO KOREA TO TURN  
BACK THE INVASION. AND WHEN THE WAR ENDED, AND PEACE WAS  
RESTORED, THE COST IN LIVES WAS TERRIBLE. BUT BECAUSE OF THESE  
SACRIFICES, FOURTY THREE MILLION PEOPLE LIVE IN PEACE AND PROSPERITY  
TODAY.**
